January 22nd (1:00pm)—“Quilt As Desired”

It is 2008 and we are kicking off the year with a great program: “Quilt as Desired”. It's the sentence that is always used at the end of pattern directions and it really does open up a world of possibilities and a world of confusion for most quilters. The program will include information about how to prepare the top and choose the batting, backing and a quilting pattern whether you are having it longarm quilted, or machine or hand quilting it yourself. Tips about attaching borders, attaching binding, and the do's and don'ts of working with a longarm quilter will be shared. A special thanks to *Cindy Clark, Cathy Fandel, Mary Johnson, and Ann Whalen* for sharing their expertise.

February 26th (9:00am-2:00pm)—Charity Quilt-In

In February, everyone is invited to attend our annual Charity Quilt-In from 9AM to 2PM. We will also celebrate Founders' Day and have a special program—Mary Beckner will share her knowledge of Teddy Bears. One of our charity projects over the years has been “comfort toys”, including bears—Mary's presentation will provide a great opportunity to learn some “tricks of the trade”.

The Charity Committee hopes that *you* are looking forward to sewing for charity as much as *we* are. It's a great feeling to be doing something special for someone...a child needing something to hug...showing a critical care or nursing home patient that someone cares. That's why all of our work is so important. Sometimes there is little we can do as individuals, but making our charity projects is something we can all do. This year our goal is to involve all members in charity projects, so we are going to do things a little differently.

For one thing, we've come up with a couple of additional projects which are easy to do, take only a little of your time, and will be packaged in kits, already cut out and ready to sew. *Please plan to come to our Charity Quilt-in February 26th* to help finish some projects, see new ones demonstrated, and help put together kits for all the members to take home. Yes, we will have bears ready to be stuffed, but we will also be making kits for lap quilts, pillow pals, Christmas stockings and wheelchair tote bags. Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time... Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please call **Linda Quinn** at **576-5071** as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.

Programs and Workshops *(Continued from Page 2)*

The following is a list of the projects that we'll work on in February:

- *Cut out bears, draw on eyes and sew on hearts by hand
- *Stuff bears that have already been sewn, hand sew the backs of those stuffed, and attach ribbons.
- *Clip outside of bears (you need sharp scissors)
- *Cut fabrics and batting in strips for lap quilts.
- *Assemble kits for lap quilts, bears, pillow pals, and wheelchair tote bags

Things you may want to bring to the Quilt-In:

- *Cutting mats, rotary cutters, rulers, good scissors
- *Knitting needles, crochet hooks, chop sticks, or other tools to help with stuffing.
- *Sewing needles, embroidery floss, thread in several colors, a pin or two
- *Your lunch and beverage. This is important because of the bonus short program after lunch.
- *If you have surplus fabric, cut some of it into 6 inch wide strips and donate it for lap quilts.
- *Be sure to put your name on anything you don't want to lose. Self-sticking address labels work well for this.

Notice we don't list sewing machines. The tools you need will be easier to carry, so please come prepared.

We will be doing demonstrations of all the projects, and all kits will include complete instructions. Labels will also be included in all kits. Make sure you insert them securely in a seam when sewing your project. Remember, your project isn't finished until the SML Quilters' label is attached. Also, door prizes will be given at every meeting that only those completing charity projects will be eligible for.

We will be celebrating Founders' Day with cake, so you don't need to bring dessert with your lunch. Thanks in advance for all your efforts. We hope to have the largest group ever for our **Quilt-In** day.

March 25th (9:00am-Noon)—Crazy Log Cabin Workshop

Linda Fiedler, a prize-winning quilt maker, teacher, author, and judge will be here in March. Her morning workshop will be Crazy Log Cabin. Linda developed this crazy log cabin piecing technique to use as a background for her unique quilts and garments. None of the blocks are the same size, and none of them are square, but Linda will show us how to sew them together using straight seams to make a pieced background that is wonderful in either quilts or garments. This is a wonderful workshop for beginning to advanced quilters. This is the technique that Linda used in her quilt, "Sampler Gone Awry" featured in the May/June 2007 issue of LOVE OF QUILTING. **Registration will begin in January and the fee is \$20.00.** You won't want to miss this experience so remember to register and pick up your materials list.

March 25th (1:00pm)—Linda Fiedler

Linda Fiedler will also be providing our **Program** in March. She will share information about her trip to Switzerland. Her factory tours included Bernina and Mettler. She also experienced a virtual tour of a needle factory. This will be a great opportunity to hear a quilter's perspective.

April 22nd (9:00am-Noon)—Appliqué Workshop

Judi Gunter, NQA certified judge, teacher, and lecturer will be here in April. She will present a 3 hr Appliqué Workshop. Participants will learn how to use a bias tape maker and a pattern overlay to appliqué an art nouveau style design. The block can be used as a quilt center or completed as a pillow. **Registration will begin in February.** Registration is limited so please remember to register and pick up your materials list.

April 22nd (1:00pm)—"Fabrics, Fun and the First Ladies"

Judi Gunter will also provide our **Program** for April. Join Judi and Phyllis Twig for a light hearted visit with the First Ladies of the White House. Hear about their times, follies, and memorable personalities. See the quilts, cottons, linens, and textiles that were popular during their times.

RECIPE from Geri Grindle—Here is the recipe for Bing Grindle's Snackers that several people have asked for at the Mountain Comfort Show:

HERB "SNACKERS"

- 2 (11 oz.) boxes oyster crackers
- 1½ cups vegetable oil
- Dash garlic salt
- Dash onion powder
- 1 tsp lemon pepper
- 1 pkg Hidden Valley Ranch Blue Cheese or Original Ranch Salad Dressing Mix

Mix oil and herbs together. Add dressing mix and pour over crackers that have been spread in a shallow pan. Bake at 200° for 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes to mix well. Store in tightly covered container.




Directions for downloading the newsletter by email:
