





Programs and Workshops

April 27 - The Singing Quilters are back! And this time, I have booked Cathy Miller for a morning workshop - Hexagons Out of the Garden. A little biographical information to refresh your memories...Cathy, a Canadian quilter and folksinger/songwriter from Vancouver, B.C. , with her musician husband, John Bunge, have, for the last nine years toured with a program of songs, stories and quilts to guilds and quilting events across North America, Australia, New Zealand, The UK and Germany. Cathy is also an accomplished quilt teacher in Hexagons as well as hand and machine appliqué.

Start with the Grandmother's Flower Garden and then transplant it to new growing zones using the English paper piecing technique. Students will be learning the easiest way to sew hexagons, eliminating two steps in the traditional technique by using plastic reusable Quilt Patis templates. The flower garden will be appliquéd onto a background fabric. The rest of the 3-hour class will concentrate on designing new patterns using hexagons. Bring home a ready-to-piece Grandmother's Flower Garden block, and a whole slew of ideas o how to make other designs using hexagons. Hand piecing suitable for beginners - 3 hour class.

Kit of 7 Quilt Patis hexagon templates and design sheets provided - purchase required (\$5.00).

She has assembled many of her friends and asked them to demo their favorite -I -can't-live -without- this- tool. We will have tables and demos lasting approximately 10 min each, similar to home spun ideas, but featuring all kinds of gadgets. Personally, I can't wait....love to find things to make cutting precisely easier, and assembling blocks a snap. Hope to see you all there, third Tuesday in May.

June 29 - (Ladies This is the 5th Tuesday of the Month.) Bunny Goode will reach us to embellish fabric and turn it into a pocketbook

Bunny Goode is a self-taught mixed media artist, designer and instructor from Point Pleasant, NJ. ("down the shore...")

Bunny teaches fabric design and doll making throughout the US, with her primary focus along the Eastern seaboard. Her designs have been welcomed in world-class galleries, shows, and by collectors.

As a teenager she began making her own clothes out of necessity. (She was 6' tall at age 12!) While in school she worked in a fabric store to support her need for fabric. She has since lost interest in making clothes for herself, but her love for fabric continues and is obvious as a doll and fabric artist, designer and instructor. Her flair for color and ability to blend textures are boldly evident in her designs.

Then came soft sculpture! What started out as little soft sculpture stocking faces on refrigerator magnets rapidly branched out into cloth doll making. Her dolls are not play dolls rather they are art dolls.

She became active in the quilting community through a friend who owned a quilt shop. That experience helped to further her exposure to fabrics and colors, always helping with customers' color palettes for classes. Bunny's first quilting experience was a beginner class, a simple 9-patch, but when she found her mind wandering away from the basic pattern she realized that traditional quilt making was not her forte. However, using the wonderful techniques from quilting has led her to design and prepare fantasy fabrics for use in many fiber arts. Fantasy and humor are Bunny's favorite themes.

As her artwork expanded, so did her choice of materials! Nothing is sacred anymore as an example, she recently realized the little pouch that vine tomatoes comes in makes a wonderful texture to interweave into her fabrics (well, after she ate the tomatoes, of course!!), and in her house there is no such thing as a piece of "scrap" fabric! Bunny uses it all with gleeful abandon.

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please call **Susan Palmer at 721-5299** as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.

Quilt Guild Challenge 2010 Girls Gotta Have Fun! Scrappy quilt.

Hello everyone! We have our first entry! Yea!!!! How are you doing? This should be a fun project... enjoy the process... no matter the outcome!

Remember you can still bring your scraps to exchange with others. Look for the table with the pile of scraps and the banner "Scrap Swap Here for Girls Gotta Have Fun". Place your scraps on the table and take what you want.

Lets go over the rules:

1. Maximum size crib quilt; no minimum size.
2. Maximum size of a piece of fabric on the front 6"; no minimum size.
3. If there are borders on the quilt it needs to follow the size requirements in #2.
4. A scrap is left over fabric from a previous project.
5. Bindings and backing do not have to follow the scrap sizes.

Have fun while making your project!



Last year we worked on basics and made Double Irish Chain quilts over several sessions. Rotary cutting, accurate seam allowances, pressing, binding, machine quilting were demonstrated and many lovely quilts were the result.

One month we had a lesson making a Majestic Mountain block and used the resulting blocks to make a border for the charity quilt we assembled.

This year we are making Row by Row quilts as a group project. The project is being worked on in secret — bags of background and focus fabrics are passing through the bee and exchanged each month. Once finished we will have a session to help everyone arrange their quilts.
