She will discuss how appraisers place a value on quilts and what today's quilt makers can do to make their work valuable for the future.

Jill, owner of Quilting Connection, has been in business 18 years, starting out on Brambleton Avenue in Roanoke. She had that location for 9 years before selling to Judy McWhorter of Creative Quilting. She enjoys sewing and quilting as much today as when she started 25 years ago. She's taught classes at a national quilt show and has designed patterns for fabric manufacturers, specializing in small quick projects that can be easily done in several days.

### March, 2012 — Karen Carter — Fabric Photo Frames

3 hour workshop — \$18 plus materials. (Kits will be available to buy for the workshop.) Class minimum is 15.
