September 27, 2011 - Judy Loope

Another wonderful teacher and speaker is Judy Loope. A resident of Salem, she began traditional guilting in the eartly 1990s, learning the techniques and tips of sewing. As an occasional guilter with young children the sewing machine became her friend, but finished pieces were few and far between. In the mid-90s, Judy made the transition from traditional to art guilts. Learning to dye, paint, print and embellish cloth, Judy realized the tactile process of working with fabrics and experimenting with material is what she enjoyed most. Inspiration for her work comes from the materials, nature, and experiments in her studio. Judy's work is shown nationally and internationally and is represented in galleries around Virginia. She also works as a commission artist for BoardWalk Consulting in Atlanta, GA, creating award-winning guilts for the Center for Disease Control, the Mayor of Atlanta, and CEOs of companies. Her lecture will be "What Was I Thinking?" and the morning workshop will be "Heat Strokes" with an added demo on "Rust Stains".
