



Programs and Workshops

September 27, 2011—Judy Loope

A resident of Salem, Judy began traditional quilting in the early 1990s, learning the techniques and tips of sewing. In the mid-90s, Judy made the transition from traditional to art quilts. Judy's work is shown nationally and internationally and is represented in galleries around Virginia. Her lecture will be "What Was I Thinking?" and the morning workshop will be "Heat Strokes" with an added demo on "Rust Stains".

October 25, 2011 — Linda Cantrell

A painter before a quilter, Linda started quilting as a hobby in 1980. Soon she was making pictorial quilts using appliqué of fabrics and embroidery thread as her paints and brushes. Linda's specialty is humorous pictorial applique. Her award-winning quilts have been exhibited nationally, including the **AQS**, **IQAS**, **NQAS**, Quilters Heritage Show, Silver Dollar City Quilt Show, Quilt America!, Dollywood Quilt Show, Indiana Heritage Show, The David and Peter Mancuso Shows. Her works are at Duke University, Southern Highland Craft Guild, and at Winston Salem and Duke Hospitals. Linda spends her time quilting, teaching quilting, or visualizing the next one.

Linda will be teaching a workshop "Fairies and Morning Glories" and the lecture for the Guild Meeting will be "Applique...I did it my way".

November 22, 2011 — Neva Hart

Neva will be our speaker (No Workshop). She is a local Quilt Appraiser and Historian in Virginia...**AQS** Certified. She is President of the Professional Assn. of Appraisers-Quilted Textiles. We are privileged to have someone with her knowledge and skills in our area. The topic of her lecture will be "Making Today's Quilts Tomorrow's Heirlooms".

Guidelines for Workshops

We have so many things going on that I thought we needed a review of the projects:

Small Pillow Cases: Pattern with directions is available at www.LakeQuilters.org/ under the Community Service Projects heading. This project was requested by Hospice Care in Rocky Mount.

Large Pillow Cases: Pattern and directions available on our website (see above). We have a need for these once again. We will be donating some of these to the Rescue Mission in Roanoke. Dot Jackson will be distributing these. We have also been asked to help Stepping Stone Mission in Rocky Mount. Lori Suon will be distributing these items.

With adding these two new Missions to our charitable giving, we can have lots of pillow cases and they can still be counted...I will submit the numbers to allpeoplequilt.com website, if that is what you want. We can make the pillow cases with or without the count.

Quilts of all sizes, Bears, and Pillow Pals: Our regular, on-going projects remain and we have also remaining **Mittens and Hats, Christmas Stockings;** plus **Tote Bags, Walker Bags and Wheelchair Bags.**

At the August Meeting we had **36 Pillow Pals, 5 Bears, 2 Tote Bags, 8 Lap or Child's Quilts, 4 Twin-size Quilts with Pillow Cases, and 11 Large Lap Quilts.**



Block of the Month 2011 Row by Row Mystery Quilt

This will be a good time to tackle those last rows and any others that got missed. Summers get so busy, and if you are like me, you get a little lax about finishing stuff.

When we meet again in October, we will be finishing the quilt; borders, binding, accent strips and backing. November will be show-and-tell month for us. I'm looking forward to hearing all about how the quilt went together. You ladies have come up with some great suggestions as we've come through the year. Thanks.

Attention! I messed up the directions for putting together row 10. It should be sewn together **light, dark, medium**. The instructions read **light, medium, dark**, but the diagram shows **light, dark, medium**. If you already have sewn it together, leave it and put it together as is. You'll have your own unique row!


