



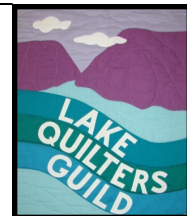

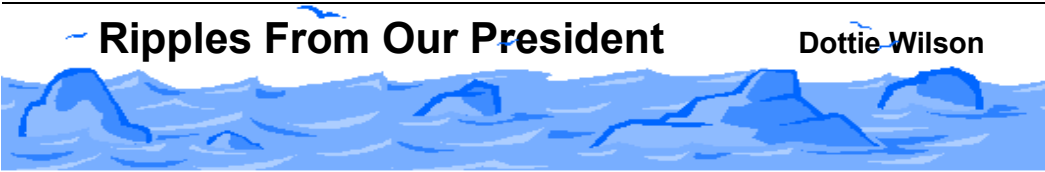

Guidelines for Workshops

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop:

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 at the Guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up. Only people who have signed-up AND paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will **NOT** be taking phone sign-ups before this time...Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please call **Teena Livsey(540-576-2031)** or **Sharon Reilly(540-297-1926)** as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.

NOTICE

A special meeting of the guild to vote on the proposed increase in dues and changes to the Guild By-Laws will be held at our meeting in October.

Here are the particulars of the Board's proposed dues increase:

- 1) Increase membership dues from \$20 to \$25.
- 2) Dues will be accepted starting at the October meeting and continuing through December 31st. Forms will be available on line and at the membership table.
- 3) Only completed membership forms and payment will be accepted at the December luncheon. The Membership Chairman will be present to receive this information.
- 4) Members who have not renewed their membership by December 31st will not be listed in the roster completed by the Membership Chairman for the following year.
- 5) Membership cards and the membership roster will be available on line no later than the January meeting.
- 6) Membership renewals will be \$25.
- 7) Membership dues for new members who join before June 30 will be \$25 and \$12.50 for those who join after June 30th.

If the membership approves these changes we will also need to change the wording in our By-Laws to reflect the new information. A copy of the proposed changes were attached to the August newsletter.

Only if the By-laws Proposal passes on October 23 will you use the **2013 Dues Renewal Form**.

A Thank you to Lake Quilters....

Twenty-four years ago this fall, my Dad called me home for one of his "talks". He was concerned that my profession was taking too much of my life and time, leaving me no time to pursue creative outlets. He advised me to plan for my retirement as I had my career. Take classes, read, and study. Find something that would "feed my soul" as I grew more accomplished, something that would bring me peace and joy. Before I left that week-end we knew I would be using my love of history, art and needlework to quilt, sew and work in stained glass. The cost of fabric and tools was small compared to the joy and sense of accomplishment I would receive.

Seven years ago I retired and soon thereafter joined the Lake Quilters Guild. There was so much to learn and you were such great quilters! There were classes to take and lectures to attend. I always took home useful techniques and tips (not all were from the teachers), even when I put away the class project saying, "At least I learned not to try that again!"

Then independent quilt shops replaced the chain fabric stores; my nose did not run and my eyes did not burn. I discovered that each shop has a personality of its own. Three shops in one town could all sell Moda fabrics with no duplicates. How wonderful is that? Now I could color with the **BIG** box of crayons!! My friends now plan trips with stops at every quilt shop on the way. We found a tiny quilt shop in Marlinton, WV last week with two quilters showing their sashiko patterns to the owner. Where could they find a teacher or shop selling sashiko supplies? With my Sew Biz card, they called and planned a road trip!

On October 4th a friend and I went to our first Sewing and Quilting Expo at Chantilly. We saw people we knew, tried out new tools and techniques, and found patterns we'd never seen before. And the quilt exhibits were straight from our quilting magazines....some were by local quilters/teachers. We had been in their classes, learning their techniques. Yes, the joy is worth the cost of fabric! Thank you Daddy and Lake Quilters! *Betty Huffman*

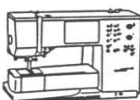

They have "shop hopped" and taken classes together. There are varying levels of quilting/sewing skills and styles.

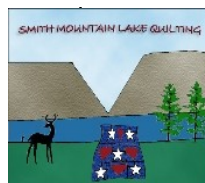
