Marianne will present a practical lecture on "sashiko". The guild will provide kits for members to follow along during the lecture. Each kit will contain needle, thread, stamped fabric. Please bring thimble, 3 inch hoop if you have one, and small scissors.

Add this program to your **2 + 2 Challenge** tool kit. Sashiko is a Japanese technique and thread used in quilting. Usually sashiko thread is a soft, white, thick thread worked in geometric patterns on a dark blue or black background fabric as quilting or embellishment. MAY FLOWERS AND FINANCES This month I want to bring you all up to date on the organizational changes that have taken place and our financial health.	Check with Kathy or Marnie if you do not have access to a computer and printer. They will arrange a printed directo- ry for you.
Under Linda Quinn and her able board, proceedings to certify our status as a 501 C7 (social club) charitable organization were begun. We recently received this designation from the IRS and it is retroactive to our incorporation date, September 29, 2011.	See page 5 for new member names. They will be listed near the Sunshine column.
 What does this mean for our members? Our dues are not tax deductible but donations from our members which are then donated to tax-exempt organizations are fully deductible by the member. This means if you use fabric, batting and/or professional quilting that you paid for, these expenses are deductible (provided you have receipts for these things). (See the list of organizations we donate to on our website.) You ask for a receipt from the Charity Committee when you bring the items in for donation. This receipt will acknowledge the items you've listed for donation to our charities. You must compute the cost of your donation as the receipt will only be an acknowledgement that the Guild has received your donation. As with the entire world, our costs have risen and our income has decreased. Our biggest expenses are our programs and our rental fees at Trinity Ecumenical Parish. Our cost is approximately \$37 per member per year. Our dues and fund raisers, such as our quilt show, provide our income. This year our membership has decreased and our fund raiser did not reach our monetary expectations. Our meeting in May will be a discussion of solutions. The board has come up with some that I will share with you at the meeting. BUT, I would like each of you to think about what direction you want your organization to be heading in the years to come and email me at lgdottie@gmail.com with your suggestions for both solutions and direction. I know the newsletter arrives close to meeting time so if you can't email me, bring them to the meeting (written out) and we'll consider them. The board will sift through and compile a list of viable ones to present to you for consideration at a later meeting. So many things are happening: graduations, travel, and visits. Guidelines for Workshops
