Diana Barrett, Sharon Cullen, Bette Gove, Mimi McDermot, Donna Moulin, Linda Pote, Nancy Robbins, and Sue Thomas are the River Queen Bees.

We meet once a month to work on various projects. Sometimes it's a charity project, as when we met and completed at least 4 pillow cases each. One of the last projects, which some of us are still working on, is the 1600 inch quilt. We each cut forty-two 2 1/2 " strips of fabric and brought them to our meeting in a paper bag. Then we passed the bags around, taking one strip out of each bag with each pass. We kept doing this until we each had a pile of forty-two strips in a new combination of fabrics. After stitching them together, two of our creative members cut the rectangle, then rotated the pieces and stitched them back together.

This year we will be making the centerpieces for the tables at the Christmas luncheon. We have openings for those who do not belong to a bee. Just call Sharon at 297-3661.
