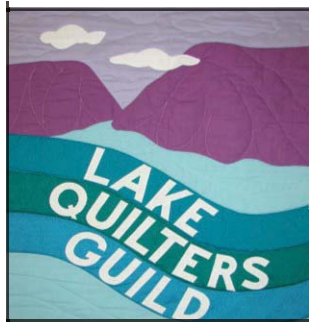

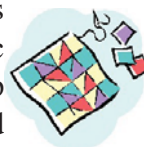

2014 PROGRAMMING PLAN

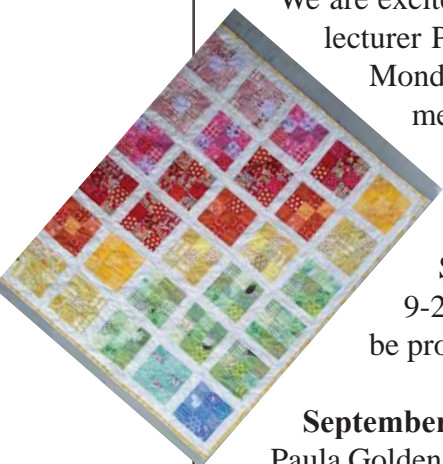
August 26th 1PM Program

Kathy Berinholtz, a local fiber artist, will present a lecture on "Hand Dyed Fabrics". She will explain several ways you can add color and interesting details to your fabric for quilting. Kathy is a multi-talented artist with a shop called "Vermillion" located inside the Artfully Framed shop here at the lake. We look forward to a great program from Kathy with loads of new fun ideas.



September 22nd - Workshop – 9-2

We are excited to have nationally known quilting teacher and lecturer Paula Golden with us for a full day workshop on Monday 22nd. The project will focus on color and movement in a beautiful project called "Bargello Boogie" with pattern resembling the flame stitch. Paula will also give us tips on "Body Smart Quilting" with an ergonomic and safe work space. Signups will begin at the July meeting. Full day 9-2 workshop class will be \$ 35 and supply list will be provided.



September 23rd- 1PM Program

Paula Golden, quilting teacher of the year winner, will present a trunk show and talk to us about choosing color and design for our quilts. Paula is from Blacksburg and is a nationally known quilter with loads of experience making beautiful quilt designs.

Workshops are special opportunities for a small group of people (usually only 20) to have instruction from a guest teacher. Please follow these guidelines when signing up for a workshop.

- Sign-up will begin at 12:30 p.m. at the guild meeting in the month announced for the workshop sign-up.
- Only people who have signed-up **AND** paid can attend the workshop. You are not considered "signed-up" until you pay your money!
- If you are unable to attend the guild meeting at which the sign-up occurs, have a friend sign you up and pay your money. We will NOT be taking phone sign-ups before this time. Please don't ask us to break this rule.
- Once the workshop is filled, a waiting list will be formed. If someone drops out of the class, the next person on the waiting list will be called. Please do not by-pass the waiting list by selling your spot to a friend. It is not fair to those who have been put on the waiting list.
- Once you are on the list, and find you will be unable to attend, you will not get a refund unless someone is found to take your place. Please contact Becky Linkous and Denise Pilversack as soon as you know you can't come and the next person on the waiting list will be called. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may then find your own replacement.
