After making her first quilt, Joyce began to design pictorial landscape quilts using raw-edge applique, thread painting, and a variety of embellishments. She never knew the "rules," so she broke a lot of them, but with exciting results! Her first art quilt won a Blue Ribbon, and since then, she has received numerous awards, recognitions and opportunities, including being named as "McCall's Quilt Designer 2012 - Professional Category" for McCall's Quilting Magazine. **All levels of quilters will enjoy this workshop. LOG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2018

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest Presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- **Three or more months prior** to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- **One month prior** to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. **(If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.)**
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, **you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.**

Please contact [Shannan Maggied](#) or [Cecily-Sue Roth](#) as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for**. If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give Shannan or Cecily-Sue your replacement's name and contact information.



There are 7 spots available for the *Jelly Roll Race* workshop on August 27.





Programs Chairs are looking for 3 more Christmas gift craft presenters for the *Christmas in September* Round Robin.

Since then two have moved, Janie Lawless to Raleigh and Marcia Wright to Bealeton, VA. They still join us for an occasional bee, always at our Christmas luncheon and January retreat.



This past year has been a difficult one for us. Peggy White became quite ill in December and it was determined she shouldn't be living alone. Her family moved her to a nursing home facility in Indiana near her oldest son. Her dog Duke, visits her every day. Sadly, we have not heard from Peggy or her family in quite a while. We hope she is doing well.



We also lost a most beloved member, Jean Hensley to cancer this Spring. She was the quiet one in our group of type "A"s but probably our most respected. She was a wonderful quilter, great teacher and always willing to share her expertise. Her handwork was exquisite. We all have items she has made and will treasure them forever. 


