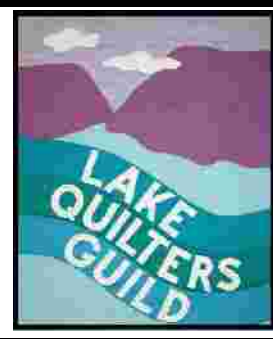

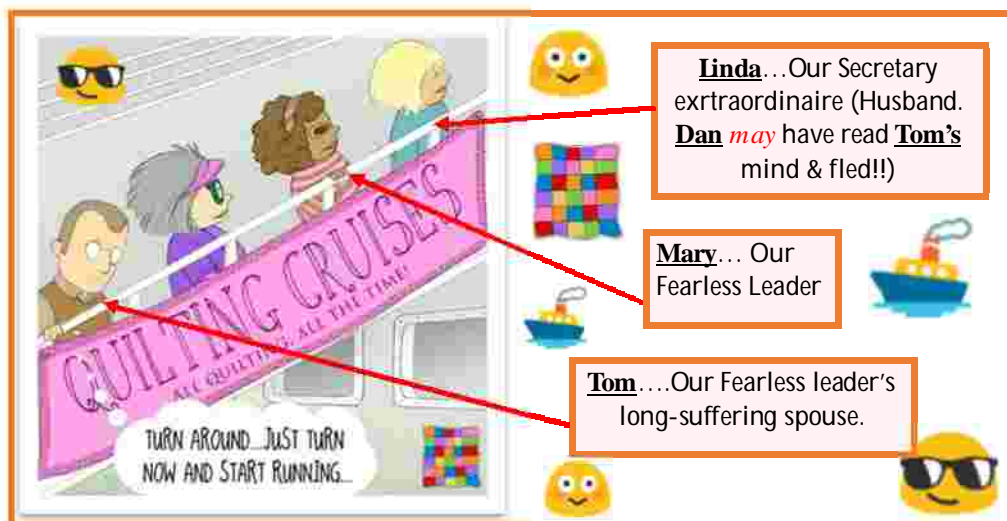

LOG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2018

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest Presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- **Three or more months prior** to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- **One month prior** to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. **(If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting.)**
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, **you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.**

Please contact [Shannan Maggied](#) or [Cecily-Sue Roth](#) as soon as you know you cannot attend a Workshop you have **signed up and paid for**. If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. If there is no one on the waiting list, you may find your own replacement and give Shannan or Cecily-Sue your replacement's name and contact information.

CLARIFICATION: At the last Regular Meeting on August 28, the Treasurer gave printouts of the current budget information to most in attendance. This information had not been submitted to Board Members in advance, nor did it give an understandable explanation of the normal **Programs** and **Workshops** expenses. The information has raised some questions. Therefore, the President has asked that the **Workshops and Programs Budgets vs. Actual Expenses Trackers** (created and used by the Programs VPs) accompany this newsletter to help answer the questions that were raised. **(SEE ATTACHMENTS)**

- Our current budget amounts are: **\$4,390 for Programs and \$3262 for Workshops, totaling \$7,652 for 2018.** This amount was **approved by the 2017 Board.** To give a little history, the total for both budgets in **2017 was \$7,800; 2016 was \$9,500 and 2015 was \$6,200.** So, as you can see, the 2018 budgets are not out of line, based on past history.
- At the top left of each spreadsheet, you will note quotes directly from the ***LQG Programs Procedures - Version 2.0 dated 6/30/11*** which explains each budget.
- Information **highlighted in yellow** indicates upcoming estimated expenses.
- All numbers shown in the far right-hand column on each page are from the Treasurer's spreadsheet.

Please review and feel free to call either Shannan or Cecily-Sue if you have any questions. Thank you for your continued support of Programs and Workshops.

I had made my own clothes as a teen, using my mother's treadle, and bought my electric Singer with my first paycheck. I took dressmaking classes at the local YWCA, and my instructor actually made my wedding gown. Making my kids clothes, I learned how to deal with stretch knits and even made my son a pair of long pants, matching all the seams, as well as finishing the fly and zipper. Quilting was very different for me – we learned how to make our own templates, copying them onto plastic, and hand sewed all ¼" seams in the first class. Second semester, we used our sewing machines. I fell in love with quilting when I saw the completed projects, and the colors leaped out at me from each quilt – same pattern, but very different looks. We had created beautiful artwork, and I was hooked forever.

LQG BOARD MINUTES

September 6, 2018

Present: Mary Hamlin, Shannan Maggied, Jackie Hodgson, Joyce Noell, Cecily-Sue Roth, Linda Walters, Sue Whitney

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Joyce reported a difference of \$.22 in balance, which after many hours of work, she could not reconcile. She also voiced her concerns about using SQUARE. A discussion on budget items and a detailed report from the program chairs on their income and expenses for 2018 followed.

MEMBERSHIP:

Sue had several questions about the income and expense sheet that Joyce presented at the guild meeting. Sue recommended that from now on membership forms be accepted on January 1, no earlier, rather than in October of the previous year and continue to be accepted until February 28 so that Membership's figures will reconcile with the yearly budget. Contact information for any member whose form is received later than February 28, will not appear in the directory which will be published in March.

Linda Walters moved that discussion of budget items for next year be tabled until the next board meeting so that all board members would have time to look over the present budget and suggest changes, additions & deletions. The motion was seconded by Sue Whitney. The board agreed. Creating a proposed budget for 2019 will be the main task at the October board meeting.

Old Business:

Sue Whitney, By-Laws Committee Chair, presented proposed by-laws as worked on by her committee. The board reviewed these and agreed to the changes the committee has made to update these by-laws. Sue and her committee will fine tune these according to board recommendations and give them to the board for approval before they are presented to the membership.

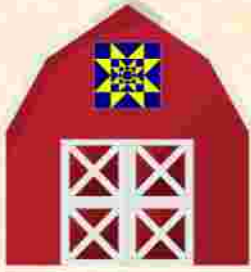
Mary presented the board with a "Pros and Cons" sheet explaining the current 501(c)3 tax status and 501(c)7 tax status that is being explored. She created this chart using information garnered from a reliable internet source and the recent meetings with Tax attorney, Ted Troland and CPA, Erich Faber. The board worked with Mary to organize the chart further and make it more reader-friendly so that it could be sent out to the membership for perusal as soon as possible.

At the last board meeting there was discussion about all members of bees being members of the guild. Shannan brought the minutes of the March 19 board meeting to our attention. These minutes state that Sue Whitney, Membership Chair stated that "bee leaders have to be paid up members of the Lake Quilters Guild". Therefore, as long as the bee leader is a paid-up member of the guild and in good standing, bees will be allowed to display and advertise in the newsletter.

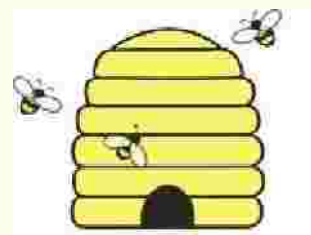

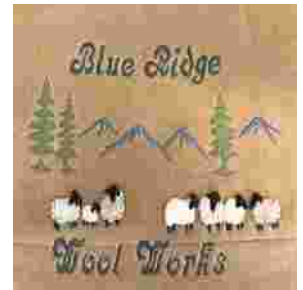
