

## LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

**LQG Workshops** are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- **Three or more months prior** to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- **One month prior** to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. **(If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).**
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, **you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.**

If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. I hope you will get in the spirit of your favorite holiday and create a wonderful magical new wall hanging.



## BOOK REVIEWS by our Librarian - Marge Weismantle


### Appliqué, Appliqué, Appliqué!

Here are two excellent books in our library on the art of appliqué.




**Bodacious Appliqué à la Carte by Margie Engel** was published by the American Quilter's Society in Paducah, Kentucky. Margie Engel has developed a step by step approach to quilt appliqué called appliqué à la carte as a way of creating beautiful appliquéed quilts that will lie flat. She also describes various techniques quilters may use to create an illusion of depth through the use of different fabrics, colored pencils and fabric markers. Another way to beautify an appliqué project is free motion embellishing with the various threads that are available today. Included in the book are several projects that include photos, patterns, and full instructions.

**Raggedy Reverse Appliqué by Kim Deneault** highlights a very different style of appliquéed quilts. Kim's Raggedy Reverse technique is easy for beginners and does not require the precision that other appliqué techniques require. The design of each quilt is determined by the combination of fabrics that are used and how those particular fabrics fray. Individual squares are made by tracing, sewing and cutting a design on the top. When the quilt is washed, the fraying of the fabric creates great texture, wonderful color variations and a double sided quilt with no batting or backing. Included in the book are photos, patterns and directions for 10 projects.

Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Sue Whitney

### Membership Report – Sue Whitney

- ◆ 126 current paid members
- ◆ 2019 workshop attendees – Veronica to send list to Sue the day after each workshop
- ◆ Sue reported that there are currently 4 members who have not listed email addresses. Jackie agreed to send letters to each one and confirm plans on how to best ensure they receive future newsletters.
- ◆ LQG pins are currently given to each new member and will go to each presenter this year.

### Treasurer's Report – Joyce Noell absent – no report

- ◆ Follow up item: We need to confirm what system is being used for our financial records and change to Quick Books (if needed).

### Program Report – Veronica Church

- ◆ Good progress is being made on the 2020 program roster.

### Newsletter – Jackie Hodgson

- ◆ Given that Jackie will be away in mid-June, that month's newsletter will be released upon her return.

### Old Business – All

- ◆ 501c7: Veronica provided further details on the rules we need to be aware of for this status; Sue will summarize for Board leadership and future guidelines
- ◆ Job Descriptions: Janet has made good progress on our job description drafts; our discussion focused on addressing open questions and identifying follow up items. One key discussion item was around the "clean up" responsibilities after Guild meetings. It was agreed that Bees will continue to be responsible for those meetings that they are leading – and that we will all help with the clean-up. The President will remind us at the end of each meeting.
- ◆ TEP Storage: Veronica has been working with the Church on securing space for stored Guild materials. Issue is considered resolved.
- ◆ 2019 Committee Chairs: Sue reported that Joyce Moorman will lead this year's Challenge Committee. We still have no one identified to lead Special Events/ Retreats.
- ◆ LQG / TEP Security Representative: Mary Hamlin will handle this responsibility.
- ◆ Ceramic Name Tags: Sue is still working on this.
- ◆ Embroidered Tags for Charity Quilts/ Projects: Veronica is making good progress on this and has confirmed screen printing on fabric will be used moving forward at a lower cost; only open issue is how to best obtain the ribbons needed.

### New Business – All

- ◆ Star Quilters Guild Quilt Show: Bev received an email from Cathy Fandel who was looking to confirm our interest in having information posted at the Show about our Guild. Jackie agreed to update our outdated brochure and provide it to them – and Bev agreed to confirm the specifics on what is needed.
- ◆ Insurance Policy: Need a copy of our current policy for Bev's records. Once we have that, the Board will review coverages and update as needed.
- ◆ First Aid Kit: Veronica volunteered to obtain a first aid kit to have on hand at Guild meetings (band aids, etc).

## Charity Report



**One hundred fifty-four bears** were finished at the February Sew-In and three of us took bears (24 in all) home to be sewn up or stuffed and sewn. In March and each month following, you will find bear patterns and stocking patterns as well as the following kits, which will include fabric, notions, and patterns for: Checker-board Quilts, Rail Fence Quilts, Bags of Hope, Walker Bags, Wheelchair Bags & 2 different kinds of bibs. We now have bins with fabric, patterns, and notions for Christmas stockings and Fidget/Sensory quilts. There are Zip-Lock bags in each bin for you to make your own kit. Bees or small groups may check out the bins for a month. We have had many donors in the past two years pass on their stash, for which we are so grateful.

For those of you who like to make "sturdier than paper" patterns for your craft projects but abhor the stiff, hard-to-cut heavy plastic matting, look at our new stocking and bib patterns. I will give you the name of my supplier and the brand at the guild meeting

Our birthday cake was almost too beautiful to eat. But we forced ourselves to make a choice between yellow or chocolate cake. The vivid blue of the sampler-quilt icing design left our sewing

crew looking like the prettiest blue-tongued skinks ever! Sorry, no left-over cake in the freezer for March, but we do have some left-over bolts of fabric which will be cut and kitted for you. You are in luck if you like Civil War reproduction fabrics and other traditional designs. Moda, anyone? See you at guild meeting!
