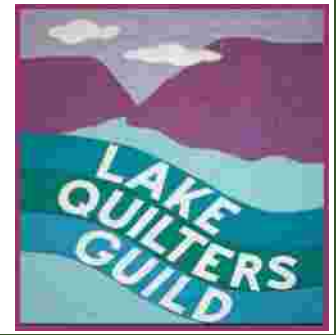

LQG WORKSHOP GUIDELINES 2019

LQG Workshops are educational and fun opportunities for small groups of quilters (generally between 15-25) to obtain valued instruction from guest presenters and learn new patterns, techniques, shortcuts and design elements, as well as develop deeper threads of friendship with other Guild members. For your information, please refer to the following Workshop Guidelines:

- **Three or more months prior** to the Workshop, signups will begin at the regular monthly meeting.
- **Two months prior** to the Workshop, if it is not filled, signups will be offered to other guilds and the general public at an additional fee.
- **One month prior** to the Workshop, if not filled, it will be cancelled and payments returned.
- Only people who have **signed up AND paid** can attend the Workshop. **You are not considered signed up until your payment is received.**
- When the Workshop is filled, a "Waiting List" sign-up sheet will be made available. If someone drops out, the next person on the Waiting List will be called. **(If you need to cancel, please DO NOT find a replacement unless there is no one waiting).**
- Once you have signed up for a Workshop and you find you are unable to attend, **you WILL NOT receive a refund unless your spot is filled.**

If applicable, they will contact the next person on the waiting list. 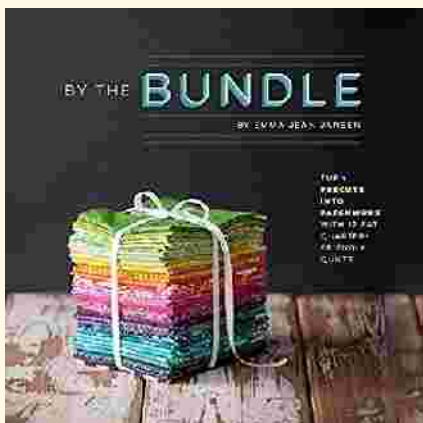
BOOK REVIEWS

Books featuring how to create two very different styles of quilts:

By the Bundle by Emma Jean Jansen



Emma Jean Jansen is a fabric designer for an Australian company, Ella Blue. She's also the owner of a quilt shop located in Victoria, Australia. The twelve projects that are profiled in her book are all photographed in the beautiful countryside of Australia. Her purpose in writing By the Bundle was to teach fellow quilters how to design and assemble beautiful and unique quilts using fat quarters that are already in their fabric stash. Emma demonstrates a variety of quilting techniques, including quick piercing methods, raw edge appliqué and freezer paper foundation piercing. All these techniques have enabled Emma to assemble eye-catching, unique, and modern style quilts. The quilts vary in complexity and level of difficulty so there is something for everyone in this book.

One Block Wonder Encore by Maxine Rosenthal & Joy Pelzmann

This book is the second in a series on the 1 block + 1 fabric kaleidoscope quilt. The concept for the first book came about when the author, Maxine Rosenthal, wanted to make a quilt out of one fabric. She discovered that she could create an amazing quilt with only one or two fabrics by cutting and piecing together hexagons or octagons of that fabric in different ways. One Block Wonder Encore takes the original concept to a whole new level by using multiple fabrics and changing up the hexagon into different shapes such as hollow cubes, cubes sliced open or blocks tumbling into the borders. Full instructions are given for the six projects that are showcased in the books.

Membership Report – Sue Whitney (absent)

Treasurer's Report – Connie Lutz

Connie provided an update of our financials

We clarified that we pay the church \$100 for each workshop day (when separate from a Guild meeting day) and \$75 for a Guild meeting day.

Program Report – Veronica Church

Veronica reviewed upcoming programs (no change from those previously communicated) and highlighted that most of recent members suggestions have been incorporated into the planning.

All quilt blocks have been donated as planned to Quilts of Valor.

Old Business – All

Quilt Labels: Veronica displayed our new Guild quilt labels ... and they are gorgeous!

Storage: No news to report on this topic.

Charitable Contributions: We will continue to solicit feedback from Guild members on suggested charities; this input will be compiled by September end and put to a full membership vote at our November business meeting.

Outdated Guild Brochure: Mary will clarify with Sue Whitney if our brochure has been updated. If not, we will make plans to do that and ensure distribution throughout key areas of the community (libraries, visitor centers, etc).

Quilt Donations for Hopes and Dreams: Mary will remind members of this request (see May Board meeting minutes) at the July Guild meeting.

Quilt Show: scheduled April 16-18, 2020): We continue to look for volunteers to lead this effort.

New Business – All

Quilt Sale Ads in Newsletter: Jackie raised the question on whether we should consider allowing Guild members to advertise quilts for sale in the Newsletter. After discussion around the pros and cons of this, we voted against this (challenging to manage the volume given limited space of Newsletter; recognition that a group of quilters is likely not the best group to attempt to sell quilts ...).

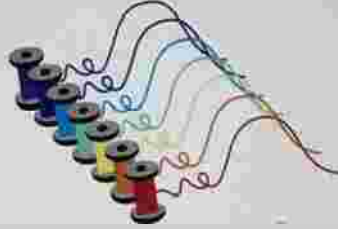

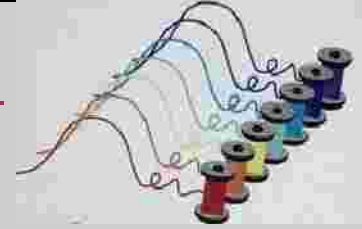
