

- Treasurer's Report Veronica details of balances, retreat, and quilt show were discussed, with final account balance of \$18,117.70. 2025 budget was amended after much discussion. Flo motioned, Bev seconded and budget was approved. After reports for committees, and discussion, Veronica motioned and Bev seconded and updates were made to the budget including \$400 for batting for Charity. Note: we will explore partnerships to fund/provide batting.
- Quilt Show Laura early plans are being explored with suggestions for consideration.
- Newsletter Jan discussion to be cognizant of putting personal info about members on the
 website, particularly about individuals' health. Special "Thank you!" to Ginger The new
 newsletter format looks awesome. Everyone will be emailed a link and the newsletter will be on
 the website.

Connecting Threads

Article: Precut and Panel Inspiration Ginger Brothers

Did you know that panel quilting can be traced back to as early as 1760? The folks at Williamsburg have researched textiles and fabric and found that precuts and preprinted fabric was used in several items due to higher quality in fabric. If you would like more information on colonial fabric and how it was used. I highly recommend checking out the textile lab at Colonial Williamsburg.

Panels are a great challenge for us this year. I am a self proclaimed panel queen and tend to lean towards them in my quilting, mainly for their use of color. Panels are a great opportunity for experimenting and introductions to new techniques. An example, I can think of and will approach with caution again is a one block wonder with panels (see the stork picture for reference). I love panels for their versatility and artistry.

This being said, my hope is for all of us to use this as an opportunity to explore new ideas. Consider this as an opportunity to make a charity quilt. Panels can help you get larger quilts, fast!





My tips for making a panel quilt

- Let the panel call to you. Panels often tell stories use it! 1.
- 2. Play with contrasting fabrics and textures.
- 3. Go with the flow, for me panel quilts tend to grow organically as I work with the fabric. This is also how my quilts become so big, you've been warned!
- Do not feel like you have to create a quilt. Bags, bibs, quilted 4. jackets, and even placemats are options too!
- 5. Don't be afraid to let your inner artist out!
