LQG BOARD MEETING MINUTES – July 2, 2024

Meeting was called to order at 12:58 p.m. by Joy Shannahan

President's Report - Joy

- August Board meeting is cancelled
- Water Authority
 - front door must be kept locked but Joy clarified that we can have someone stand by the door and let people in as they arrive; side door will continue to remain unlocked
 - this location will be unavailable for January 2025 (Flo on point to check with Saunders); once they have their calendar available for next year, Flo will confirm our dates with them.
- February 2025 Arlene will need a substitute (so either Joy or President Elect)

Secretary's Report - No report (Fran absent)

Treasurer's Report - Veronica

- Bank balance as of 6/30/2024: \$23,551.27
- > Quilt show financials are still being compiled.
- Decision was made to not pursue interest bearing account for Guild funds because balance requirements are too high.
- ➤ Bev agreed to research information on the Kroger "Smile" account where members can designate a % of their Kroger spending to come back to the Guild as a 501(c)3 organization. Note: this \$\$ comes from Kroger as part of their charitable giving program.
- ➤ Given how late we are into this year, we decided to forgo changing the signature cards at the bank until Arlene takes over as President in January 2025.

Charity – Janet

- ➤ Patterns and kits will be available for any member who wishes to work on them at our upcoming Fellowship Day.
- ➤ A full list of recently donated items will be in the next newsletter.

Quilt Show - Gail

- Thank you notes are being sent.
- > We all agreed that Eastlake Church was a great location for our show and we would ideally like to use it again next time.
- ➤ Gail is working on a feedback survey (for members) to gather input for the 2026 Quilt Show committee.

Quilt Raffle – discussion deferred until next meeting

Newsletter – Jan

Moving forward, we decided to only use the Website to post the newsletter (links will continue to be sent to members via email); Janet confirmed that all 2024 newsletters (January through June) are now out there.

Membership Report – Bev

- > Bev reported that we have 79 members, which includes 7 businesses and 3 at-large members
- ➤ Bev distributed a summary of "interests and talents" from the 13 new member applications just received.
- ➤ 2 of our new members have already joined Bees and 3 others are interested in learning more about them; Bev has asked Judy to reach out to them with information on how to get involved.

Programs – Flo

- ➤ Flo gave a recap of upcoming Programs (into 2025) and agreed to contact Saunders to confirm our October needs.
- ➤ In September, we will celebrate Jelly Roll month details will be in the upcoming newsletter.
- Arlene will help with contracting with a "pending" speaker for 2025; more discussion on this will happen at our September meeting.

CORE – Jan absent

- Veronica confirmed that we currently have 11 people signed up for the Virginia Quilt Museum bus trip (September); we will need 34 by the end of this month to actually hold this event. Janet has invited Peaks & Pieces as well as Star Quilters to sign up.
- Last CORE session (Batik blocks) was a success from an attendance perspective.

Publicity – Janet

- Newsletters posted to our website (see Newsletter section).
- ➤ Ginger Brothers has expressed interest in taking the lead to get us more active on Instagram; Janet will follow up to confirm details.

President Elect - Arlene

Arlene let us know that a Gretna sewing group is interested in hosting an Operation Kid Comfort event, and we would also like to do this again next year. Arlene will work with Programs on setting a date for this.

Challenge – Jan

➤ 30 people have signed up for this year's challenge – initially the challenge was to use the colors from a candy wrapper plus one of your own to make a 14" square wall hanging. The rules have since been modified; challenge participants are now able to use any colors they Wish (but must use at least two colors from the candy wrapper.)


