To date, we have sold approx. 3768 tickets for a net total of \$3217.53.

CORE - Jan E-B

- Eleven people have signed up for the September bus trip, we need at least 34 to break even. All money must be in by July guild meeting. We can take 50 people maximum.
- Janet will reach out to Star Quilters and Peaks and Pieces Guilds to invite their members. Perhaps the modern quilt guild in Lynchburg as well.
- All monies should be mailed to Veronica.
- June batik block on June 13th, Joy and Judy will help.

- Gail and Joy will be interviewed in the WDBJ studios on Wednesday June 5 for the Here at Home segment regarding the quilt show.

President-elect - none

Challenge – Jan Brockman

- 25 members have signed up to participate in the challenge.

Retreat - Veronica

- We have 15 people signed up, will need 3-5 more
- September 1 deadline to sign up and pay.

Bees – Judy

- Several people have expressed interest in starting an art quilt bee.

Ways and Means – June not here

- We need to get help for June, perhaps after things have settled down from the show.
- Books and magazines will be sold at the July meeting if June feels up to bringing them, this should free up some space in the storage unit.
- There will be a big sale for Ways and Means in September.

Other Business

- We need to get working on a nominating committee for 2025 when the show is over.
- Storage Unit

Jan E-B and Ginger Brothers made some valid points about not switching to a climate-controlled unit, as that doesn't really help the fabric, and is a much bigger expense.

Primary users of the storage unit are the quilt show, ways & means, and charity. The amount of stuff from the quilt show does not vary, but the other two are the big users. We need a big clean out of the Ways & Means and Charity items – many things are not desirable and should be gotten rid of through Goodwill or the trash. It was decided to have a culling party in June after the show of these items, Bev will lead.

Members need to be encouraged to take charity kits, especially at the July Fellowship program.

We will revisit the storage unit discussion after the culling party.

The price of a 10x10 storage unit (currently have 10x5) is \$1069.20. Our next payment is not due until the end of September, so we can make a decision before then.

Quilt Show - Gail

- Team is feeling very good about all areas of the show planning.
- Ann Swank is finishing making the raffle baskets and they look great.
- Cindy Holland is working on final tweaks of volunteer scheduling.
- There will be about 10 people operating Square for all payments at the show. There will be some training on this app on Thursday at the show set up.
- The Hollins bill will come after the show.
- Lyn will have all unsold Boutique items to return after the show. Perhaps some could be used as door prizes at the Quilts of Honor event in November.
- Money management at the show: Veronica will take all cash at the end of each day. She will replenish the change each day as needed. Deadline to get change replenished is 4pm on Friday and before noon on Saturday.
- No personal checks or Venmo will be accepted.
- Each table (raffle, entry tickets, Boutique, membership, etc.) will take money for their items only (no central checkout table).

The meeting was adjourned at 2:55pm.
