Arlene called the meeting to order at 2 pm.

President's Report (Arlene)

- 1) Arlene received several positive comments about the Global Connections virtual learning sessions held this past Saturday and Sunday. She is compiling information from members to determine who we might consider for upcoming virtual learning classes for our own Guild.
- 2) Arlene led a discussion confirming planning details for the upcoming May 10 SMAC event. Jan, Cindy and Joy are in the lead for set up, and Cindy reported that we have volunteers signed up for every 2 hours. We discussed the idea of selling leftover boutique items to our own membership at meetings and decided it best to hold the items for public events where the revenue can be used to meet the Guild's "external" income IRS requirements.

Secretary's Report (Bev for Lyn)

Bev circulated the draft of the Board / Committee Chair listing for review and final edits. The approved document will be sent out to all Board and Committee Chairs.

Treasurer's Report (Veronica)

- 1) We discussed this year's budget with recast membership numbers (slightly lower than plan). Original budget stands.
- 2) Veronica distributed last month's financial statement; balance is currently \$19,691.40. Charity (Mary and Ann)
- 1) Veronica confirmed that she has everything she needs to close out the 2024 Charity report.
- 2) Quilt labels will be ordered as soon as Veronica has a fully functioning debit card.
- 3) Veronica reports that the Rocky Mount Police Department has requested stuffed owls and pillow cases for situations where they need to take children from their homes. She will send the owl pattern to Ann.
- 4) Ann reported that two cutting party dates have been put on the calendar at the Moneta Library: June 16 and July 23, 1 4 pm. Details will be in the upcoming Newsletter.

#### Membership (Bev)

We currently have 76 members (69 regular, 7 at large).

Community Outreach (Jan)

- 1) Jan reported that the small quilt show signs we used outside of the Moneta Library have gone missing. Next year's quilt show group needs to replace them if needed.

This activity is for anyone who enjoys cutting fabric and/or planning quilts.


If you are looking for something to do on the hot days of summer don't forget we need NICU hearts, queen sized quilts, Christmas ornaments and stockings.

## **Connecting Threads - Hidden Worlds of Quilting**

Once upon a time, humanity began stitching hides together to shield themselves from the elements. In my anthropology classes, this along with the setting of bones marked a change in the culture of humanity. As this culture developed it has gone deeper than the fabric, it's in our language and even hidden in plain site. According to quilting lore and Dr. John Oldani, the classic limerick "ennie, meenie, miney, moe" was initially used as a way to teach others how to build squares. Each of the variations of this folk limerick reflects the area that it is based in. My personal favorite is,

"Ennie, meenie, miney, judge Catch a quilt with a yellow smudge If the stain is big and messy Use the quilt to warm ol'Bessie"

Isn't fun to think about how we are connected to the stitchers before us and the ones yet to come through our words, fabric choices, and quilts?

When I took over this newsletter, I hoped this would be a space for use to share our ideas and thoughts. I get it, writing a blurb or presenting in front of others is scary, but this community does not exist without our members. I have no problem researching ideas and being creative, but playing to crickets is just as terrifying as speaking up. ## **Quilter's Superstitions, Hexes, and Customs**

- As you are "frogging" (ripping) say one person's name as a mantra. This serves as a hex on the person you name and therapy for you, the quilter.
- If you drop your quilting needle and it sticks straight up on the floor, company is coming.
- If you make a quilt for your child with "wandering" or "tracks" in the pattern name, they will travel away from home.
- It is customary for the quilter to sleep under a quilt they made for the first night to ensure good luck to the new owners.
- Use a small piece of yellow in all your quilts.
   The yellow symbolizes the sun and will give the owner good luck.
- It was customary that all brides should have 13 quilts in their hope chests, the 13th was intended for her to use with her husband.
- Every quilt should have a piece of silk in it.
   Silk is considered to be the luckiest fabric.
