

LQG BOARD MEETING MINUTES – November 4th, 2025

- Arlene opened the meeting with our decision that there will be no December Board Meeting and with reminder that the November Guild meeting on November 18, 2025 will be our annual business meeting, voting on the proposed slate of officers, with only the Hospitality Chair position still open. Also, Committee Meeting Reports are due to Arlene for the current year ending 2025.
- Laura led a discussion of the 2026 Quilt Show plans. There was a reminder that our general guidelines require that all expenditures need Board approval. The first discussion centered around a proposed budget, primarily for the printing expenses needed for raffle quilt tickets and signage for that purpose as soon as possible. All printed materials are required to include the 501c(3) information. Laura made a motion to proceed with the quote for Savvy Promos, Veronica seconded, vote passed unanimously. We will try to consolidate all printing with that one vendor, except the programs. The subject of show programs was widely discussed with many opinions regarding the need, the cost, the quantity, and the Quilt Show Committee will make and present a proposal going forward. After discussion regarding the quantity of tickets to advance to each guild member, Arlene made a motion to have the packet of tickets distributed to include 30 tickets in each envelope, which math allows the 6/\$5.00 or individual tickets for \$1.00. Flo seconded, and the vote was unanimous. Laura will get a quote for printed envelopes to hand out tickets. Cash will be handed in to the raffle quilt committee as members sell all their tickets. Signage was also discussed, and again the quilt show committee will need to consider using our existing signage as well as new signs for the location needs for Rocky Mount. We also need contact information for individuals at the Franklin County HS since the show will be held during the two weeks the building is generally closed to students and employees.
- Laura will request sign-ups at the November guild meeting for the November Lakeside Local Market and SMAC opportunities to begin to sell tickets. Jan EB proposed selling tickets at the Moneta Library craft sale in November.
- Arlene provided a copy of the contract for quilt judge Scott A. Murkin at a rate of \$550 for the whole day, plus
 reimbursement for meals and travel. The show committee will create the judging form, with examples provided
 by Arlene.
- Joy suggested using mini fabric quilts as signage for "do not touch, etc." Another suggestion was to have the
 raffle baskets displayed with ticket sales for them and the quilt at the Farmer's Market the weekend before the
 show. And discussion centered around signage on quilts for sale, consignment fees, and using Square for Master
- Card and VISA only (no American Express or Discover due to high fees).
- Veronica showed LQG funds available of \$19,264.61 and the bank balance 9/30/25 is \$26,719.21, and reviewed both the 2025 budget/actual, the proposed budget for the first half 2026, as well as the 2026 Quilt Show budget.
- The charity quilt label stamp is on its way in the next 2 weeks.
- Flo reviewed the in-depth programs schedule for 2026 with proposed locations. There was discussion that Jan
- EB will find out the future cost of Saunders Firehouse and schedule availability, and Laura will nail down
- Resurrection availability for the completed Program schedule for both the Mondays needed as well as Tuesdays.
- Melissa (Fork Mountain) is donating back the \$100 for her workshop but is owed \$45 for patterns provided. At
 the November guild business meeting the committee chairs will be asked to provide brief overviews from their
 committees. Two patriotic quilts will be selected then for presentation in February to two selected individuals.

- Lyn will create specific individual labels for those quilts and will provide cupcakes for that presentation. Flo will email information copies of the program schedule to board members who are not on the Programs committee.
- Bev handed out the new membership form.
- Jan EB will review information at the November meeting for the Moneta Library Craft show items table (drop-off Friday 11/21 at 4:00 with set-up after) and review the volunteer schedule for that Saturday.
- Jan Brockman will chair the 2026 Challenge, still looking for Hospitality Chair, and the suggestion was made that
 we ask members to volunteer and sign up in teams of two to be greeters and schedule for one meeting for each
 team to greet and look after new members at that meeting.
- Arlene closed the meeting by thanking the Board for making the meetings easy and enjoyable during her tenure.
- Meeting ended at 2:59.
